2406/1 Apologies

2406/2 Declaration of interest

Cllr Haigh's declaration of acceptance of office was signed in the presence of the meeting.

2406/3 Parish Council Standing Orders were suspended to allow members of the public and press to make comments and representations for a period of 30 minutes.

A member of the public raised concern about the Data Centre with this being a huge project and was disappointed the Parish Council had not publicised this as they felt the PC needed to engage with the community and this being known to NLC for 3-4 months.

A resident raised the concern of noise pollution and open countryside. A concern was raised that this was against the village and detrimental.

The weight limit of 7.5T on Top Road was raised as a concern for vehicles despite the right turn only out of Habrough Road.

Cllr K Hesketh commended the author of the letter sent anonymously to residents; Ward Cllr Richard Hannigan stated this letter was 50% fact.

A parishioner asked for a vote in the room of those members of the public who were for and against the data centre with the result of 2 voting for, 19 voting against.
