**2602/9 Community Centre**

### **2602/10 Parish matters**

- I. Maintenance in village including Footpaths, verges, roads potholes  
The Fix My Street App link is on Facebook  
Cllr Hannigan has been around the village with a resident and seen all the potholes first hand and has taken pictures which he will submit.
- II. Feedback from outside organisations: CAG, NATs, NLAG, SKNPC  
The school was awarded the remaining CAG budget for laptops and a park gate at North Killingholme.  
The next NATs meeting is at Barrow on the 11<sup>th</sup> Feb.  
The Clerk will request the lease for the Community Field from North Lincs
- III. Police reports – there have been further motorbike incidents on the field. Clerk to report on 101
- IV. Village sign – there is no update
- V. Village benches – the benches have been received and are stored at the community centre. These will be installed in better weather conditions.
- VI. Data Centre – Cllr K Hesketh mentioned that 161 parishioners objected to the data centre on the Portal and the then Parish Council majority vote was in favour. A magazine called New World have analysed 17 Data Centres and found there are very few high-powered jobs and that there are only about 20 jobs available.  
Cllr Haigh stated that the Data Centre is going ahead and this type of Data Centre will have more than a skeleton staff because of the type of it is; it has been delayed as they couldn't get enough power. The Orsted powerline is not an option and a contract has now been agreed for power and secured a dedicated powerline which can not be put in place until 2031 or 2032 and construction would start around 2027/8.
- VII. Phillips 66 / LOR – Phillips 66 is looking at buying LOR and using some of the site including the railway line and storage tanks.
- VIII. Stallingborough Generating Plant with Carbon Capture – no update
